The Armenian Genocide Resolution

<u>The right resolution:</u> H.Res.106 puts America back on the right side of a vital moral issue, reaffirming our unique role in promoting human rights.

Message: We advance U.S. interests when we stand up for America values.

<u>At the right time:</u> The ongoing Darfur Genocide underscores the need to help end the cycle of genocide by showing that America's opposition to all genocide, past and present, is unconditional.

Message: The precedent set by Turkey's denial only emboldens future leaders to consider genocide, secure in the knowledge that political leverage can shield them from condemnation.

Message: Before invading Poland in 1939, Hitler dismissed objections by asking: "Who, after all, speaks today of the annihilation of the Armenians?"

Message: Many of the same tactics used by the Ottoman Empire againstArmenians in 1915 are being used again today in Darfur.

With the right support: H.Res.106 enjoys bipartisan support from over 210 cosponsors and was approved 27-21 in the Foreign Affairs Committee. It is endorsed by human rights, academic, faith-based, and ethnic groups representing millions of Americans.

Message: The Congress should join with 40 U.S. states and more than 20 nations, including 11 NATO allies, in recognizing the Armenian Genocide.
