The Turkish government continues to deny Ottoman Turkey's systematic and deliberate massacre of 1.5 million Armenians between 1915 and 1923.

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U.S. SUPPORT FOR ARMENIA AND NAGORNO KARABAGH

The U.S. has provided over \$1.5 billion in developmental and humanitarian aid to strengthen Armenia's independence, promote economic self-sufficiency, advance democratic pluralism, and help the Armenian people overcome the severe hardships caused by the dual Turkish and Azerbaijani blockades. The U.S. also sends direct aid to Nagorno Karabagh to meet humanitarian needs and as a confidence-building measure to support a negotiated settlement of the conflict.

In 2001, the Congress granted the President limited authority vaive this law. |

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THE TURKISH BLOCKADE OF ARMENIA

For the past decade Turkey has obstructed the delivery of U.S. humanitarian aid and other shipments to Armenia, sharply impacting Armenia's economy and denied food, fuel, and medical supplies to those in need. The Humanitarian Aid Corridor Act, which became law in 1996 and was subsequently waived by the President on national security grounds, prohibited U.S. foreign aid to nations, such as Turkey, which obstruct U.S. humanitarian aid deliveries to a third nation.
